Sermon Outline

Research, write, and preach a narrative sermon based on Peter's experience with Dorcas and the church leaders from Joppa.

Bible Passage:

Peter and Dorcas. Acts 9:32-43

Sermon Thesis:

When God calls, He empowers.

Key Thoughts:

- How do you know when you've been "called."
- Is there any task that you would be afraid of doing for God?
- Why did God involve laymen from Joppa in the calling of Peter?

Research:

- The distance and topography from Lydda to Joppa.
- Wikipedia information on Joppa. Where? Products? Languages? Population? Etc.
- What did Dorcas "do," and for whom?
- What is the significance of Dorcas being known in three languages? *Dorcas, Tabitha, Gazelle.*
- Describe the room what Dorcas was lying colors, odors, textures...

Imagine:

- What drew Peter to heal Aeneas.
- What emotions Peter felt when the men from Joppa begged him to come with them.
- Compassion, fear, uncertainty, urgency, hope...
- Being asked to heal someone with AIDS.
- Being asked to raise someone from the dead.
- Listening to a hundred distraught widows showing you what Dorcas had done for them.

Purple Passages to try:

- "Walking into her room was like walking into a kaleidoscope where all the colors were spinning."
- "They assumed I would follow, like Centurions commanding their men to do the impossible, immediately."
- "Her face was lined with a thousand remembered smiles."
- "She rose hungry, yet eager to provide me a meal."

STOP Signs that provide good spots for inserting local stories:

- Aeneas telling everyone about Jesus. "Remember when ----- joined the church, how eager she was to tell everyone about Jesus..."
- Two men asking Peter to go with them to Joppa. "My phone rang at midnight..."
- Women telling showing off their Dorcas clothes. "Last week, when three of you delivered a new mattress to a family of refugees from Thailand..."
- Halfway to Joppa. "Sometimes I know I'm in over my head..."
